H. PROPERTY CLASSIFICATION

Site Area

A site can be the location of a significant event, a prehistoric or historic occupation or activity, or a building or structure, whether standing, ruined, or vanished, where the location itself possesses historic, cultural, or archaeological value regardless of the value of any existing structure.

District Area

A district possesses a significant concentration, linkage, or continuity of sites, buildings, structures, or objects united historically or aesthetically by plan or physical development.

Building

A building such as a house, church, hotel created principally to shelter any form of human activity. A "building" may also be used to refer to a historically and functionally related unit, such as a courthouse and jail.

Structure

The term "structure" is used to distinguish from buildings - its function was principally to shelter any form of human activity. Structures can be pillboxes, bookshelves, shrines or monuments.

Object

The term "object" is used to distinguish from buildings and structures. Objects are primarily artistic in nature or are relatively small in scale and simply created, although it may be by nature or design, movable, an object is associated with a specific setting or environment.
